

Stanton St Quintin NDP – Listed buildings and Sites of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI)

Listed Buildings

There are 36 listed buildings within the parish boundary¹. Of these, 23 are within the boundary of the parish portion of Buckley Barracks (see separate list). The remainder are:

- a. Grade II. Stanton Church
- Lower Stanton Farmhouse
- Glebe Farmhouse and privy
- Avils Farmhouse
- Barn at Avils Farm
- School Cottage
- Stanton Court
- The Church Gate
- Barn at Manor Farm
- Dovecote at the Manor
- 3 groups of Churchyard Monuments (totalling 19 memorials)

One Ancient Monument, the moated site 500m NW of Nables Farms. GR929805.

SSSI

There are two SSSI in the parish, Stanton St. Quintin Quarry and M4 Motorway Cutting². They are geological SSSI because: These two localities expose a continuous composite section from the top of the Middle Jurassic Forest Marble (Upper Bathonian) up to the base of the Kellaways Beds (Lower Callovian). They therefore provide one of the country's few complete exposures of the Cornbrash, a formation developed along most of the length of the English Jurassic outcrop. These sections have yielded ammonites of biostratigraphic importance *Clydoniceras*, *Macrocephalites*. They display a thick development of the Lower Cornbrash, while the motorway cutting section shows that the Upper Cornbrash of the region is actually developed in Kellaways Beds facies. The Lower Cornbrash of both cutting and quarry is notably fossiliferous, yielding characteristic fossils, as well as more localised species such as *Ornithella foxleyensis*.
